What's a Wiki?

- Definition: A collection of web-pages which can be edited by anyone, at any time, from anywhere.
- · Wiki is short for "Wiki-Wiki Web". It's an alliterative substitute for "quick", as visitors to Hawaii may know.
- The first Wiki web site was founded in 1995, and many others have followed. There are several different versions of the software for various platforms.
- The point of a Wiki is to allow input from many members of a community. Anyone can insert new information, correct errors, or clean up ugly formatting or incorrect spelling.
- There are simple rules for adding text and links, so the user doesn't need to be an HTML wizard.




The Stanford GLAST Wiki

- Its URL is http://www-glast.stanford.edu/cgi-prot/wiki.
- It is located behind the standard password protection, so only people working on GLAST can add content. No other authorization is needed.
- Organization: The top-level page contains only links to other pages,
 which are devoted to single topics. Anyone could add a new page.
- There's read-only access at http://www-glast.stanford.edu/cgi-bin/wiki. Currently it shows only the Unidentified Sources page, although a clever user could navigate to other pages.
- It uses the UseModWiki software from usemod.com, which is a Perl CGI script.
- I don't believe this could be done at SLAC or GSFC (?) because of network security restrictions.
